

Loch Ness 360°

The Loch Ness 360° Trail is a 116km (72 mile) long distance circular trail. It follows the Great Glen Way on the north side of Loch Ness and the South Loch Ness Trail on the south side.

Although most users will start / finish the trail at either Fort Augustus or Inverness, there are sections of it that pass through settlements around the loch, and / or run parallel with minor roads, enabling easy access to it at multiple points. It is expected that walkers will take 5-6 days to complete the trail.

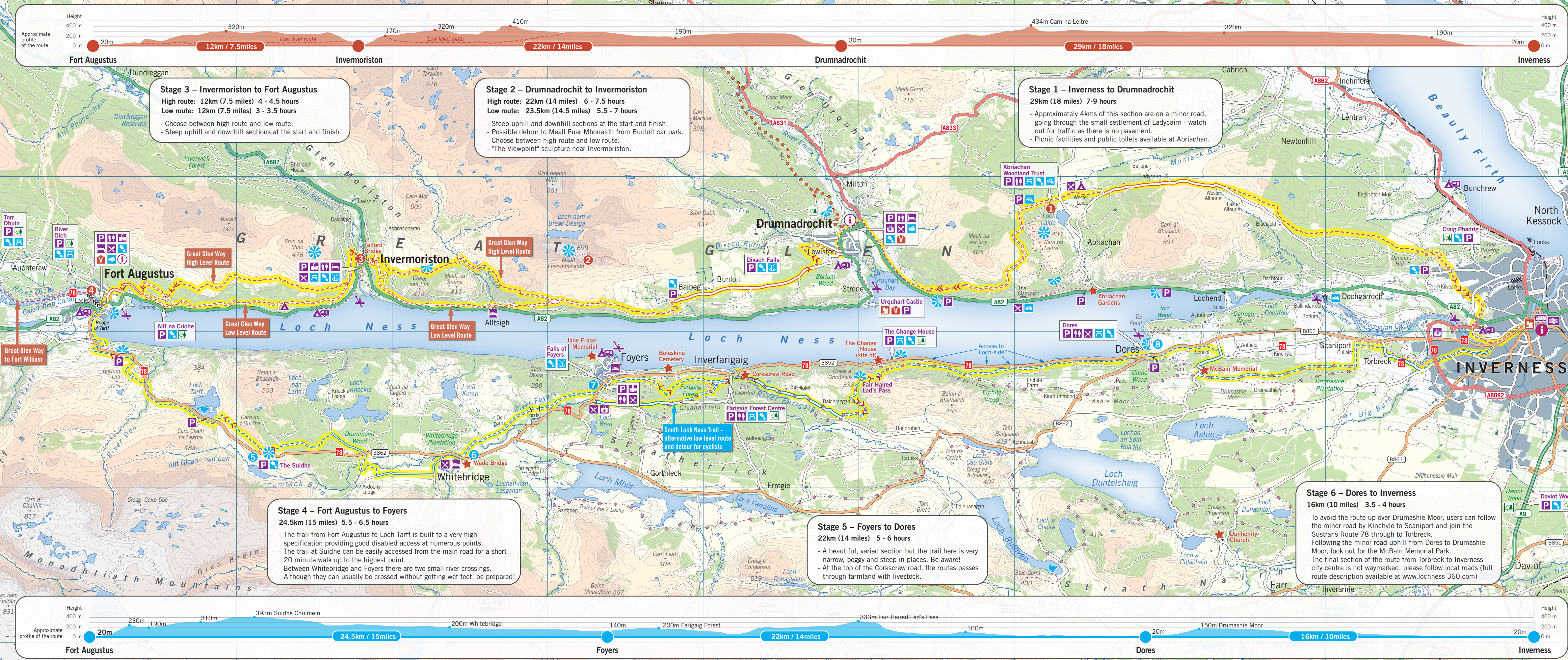

Some points of interest along the way.

- 1 Abriachan Woodland Trust - Hiking and biking trails for all the family.
- 2 Meall Fuar-mhonaigh - 699m height, for amazing 360° views as far as the eye can see!
- 3 Telford Bridge, Invermoriston - part of the military road from Fort Augustus to Inverness, completed in 1813
- 4 The Caledonian Canal, Fort Augustus - a staircase of 5 locks and a swing bridge lead down to Loch Ness.
- 5 The Suidhe - a great viewpoint.
- 6 Wade Bridge, Whitebridge - single span bridge built in 1732 as part of the military road from Fort Augustus to Inverness.
- 7 The Falls of Foyers - famous since Victorian times.
- 8 Dores Beach - classic view along Loch Ness.
